




Lufkin's Future FTZ Service Area

Lufkin's Unique Value to East Texas



Strategic Location

- Geographic proximity to major cities like Houston, Beaumont,
 Shreveport and Dallas
- The retail and medical hub of a 12-county region in East Texas with an estimated labor force of more than 145,000
- Texas has 32 FTZs, but none presently serving the East Texas region where Lufkin is located

Established Multi-Modal Transportation Infrastructure

Highway, rail, and air – future inland port potential

Existing, Abundant Resources

- Large undeveloped areas of land
 - > 39.29 available acres in business park
 - 96.82 available acres of industrial and commercial property



What is an FTZ?



- ► A Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) is an area of land physically located within the US but considered outside of the US for customs purposes.
- The grantee, often a public entity or quasi-public entity, holds the grant from the FTZ Board (Dept. of Commerce) for the geographic area
 - E.g., Port of Houston Authority, City of Lufkin
- The <u>operator</u> contracts with the grantee to run the zone on a day-to-day basis, is generally responsible for recordkeeping and dealing with Customs, and benefits from using zone procedures
 - E.g., ABC Company, XYZ Business Park, etc.



Current U.S. FTZ Activity




- General Purpose FTZs in the US
 - Almost 300 designated, 32 in Texas
- Subzones
 - Over 500 subzones have been approved
- Total Value
 - \$798 billion received into active FTZs
 - Includes domestic status merchandise
 - \$99 billion exported from active FTZs
 - Does not include indirect exports

FTZ Usage



- Over 3,000 companies currently operate FTZs in the US
- Virtually every industry takes advantage of the FTZ program:
 - Automotive (vehicles and vehicle parts)
 - Oil/Petroleum and Petrochemicals
 - Machinery / Equipment
 - Beverages / Spirits
 - Food / Tobacco products

- Consumer electronics
- Textiles / footwear
- Pharmaceuticals
- Plastic / rubber
- Aircraft / aerospace
- Ships / boats
- Other metals / minerals



How will the FTZ benefit Lufkin?




- Assist economic development / recovery efforts
- Help attract offshore activity and encourage retention of domestic activity
- Facilitate, encourage and expedite international trade
- Provide special customs procedures as a public service to help firms conduct international trade-related operations in competition with foreign plants
- Encourage US exports
- Generate employment opportunities in the area
- Generate revenue for the City of Lufkin

Avoiding Inverted Tariffs



- Inverted tariff occurs when the duty rate of the component is higher than the duty rate of the finished product
- FTZ user may elect duty rate of component or finished product
- No duty on U.S. value added to finished product



3.4% duty rate on cell phone battery


10.5 cents/bbl duty on imported crude oil

Ongoing Grantee Responsibilities



- File annual report with FTZ Board in OFIS (by March 31st)
- Assist new FTZ users with application preparation and filing with the FTZ Board; operator agreements
- Facilitate / participate in activation meetings with CBP
- Monitor any changes to grantee structure and underlying documents
 - Grantee charter, fee schedule, points of contact
 - Operator/User Agreements
 - Designated service area
- Respond to periodic inquiries from the FTZ Board
- Update/manage marketing materials for future economic development
